



Introduction

This easy-to-use Quick Reference Guide is intended to provide you with a user-friendly learning experience to quickly acquaint you with your new Infiniti.

- The Quick Reference Guide will help you to more fully appreciate your vehicle's superior features, unique functions and advanced technology.
- Refer to the Quick Reference guide to learn how to personalize your vehicle's controls and equipment to maximize your driving comfort and convenience.

However, this guide is not intended as a substitute for your vehicle's Owner's Manual. For comprehensive product and vehicle safety information, please refer to your Owner's Manual. It will help you to better understand the operation and proper maintenance of your new Infinitivehicle.

Both Infiniti and your Infiniti dealer are dedicated to serving all your automotive needs. Your complete satisfaction is our primary concern. It is suggested that you read this Quick Reference Guide and your vehicle's Owner's Manual thoroughly before contacting your Infiniti dealer with related questions.



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REMOTE KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM (KEYFOB)

(if so equipped)

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

The Remote Keyless Entry system (Keyfob) allows you to lock and unlock all doors (including the lift gate), open and close the front windows, and activate a panic alarm—all from outside the vehicle.

INTELLIGENT KEY SYSTEM (if so equipped)

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

Similar to the Remote Keyless Entry system, the Intelligent Key system also lets you lock and unlock all doors (including the lift gate), open and close the front windows, and activate a panic alarm from outside your vehicle. What makes these systems differ is the ability to perform some of these functions—as well as start and stop the engine—without having to remove the Intelligent Key from your pocket or bag.



Several vehicle features can be tied to a specific Intelligent Key. Attached to your Intelligent Keys are color-coded key ring clips which conveniently distinguish one driver's Intelligent Key from another.

KEYFOB AND INTELLIGENT KEY

The Keyfob and Intelligent Key will operate up to approximately 33 feet from the vehicle.



REMOTE KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM (KEYFOB) FEATURES AUTO UNLOCK FUNCTION

This feature helps to prevent accidentally locking the key in the car. It will not allow the doors to lock if the key is still in the ignition switch, **OFF** position.

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INTELLIGENT KEY SYSTEM FEATURES STARTING THE ENGINE

Push **IN** the ignition switch/knob, and confirm the Intelligent Key Warning Light (located in the top center area of the Instrument Cluster) is illuminated green . Then, turn the ignition switch/knob to start the engine.



LOCK/UNLOCK OPERATION - DRIVER AND FRONT-PASSENGER DOOR HANDLE REQUEST SWITCHES

- Locking Doors Push any door handle Request Switch once.
- Unlocking Doors Push any door handle Request Switch once.
 The corresponding door will unlock. Push the door handle
 Request Switch again within 5 seconds to unlock all other doors
 (including the fuel-filler door and lift gate).



Note: When the driver's door handle Request Switch is pressed once to unlock the door, the fuel-filler door will also unlock.

OUTSIDE BUZZER AND LOCKOUT PROTECTION

If you attempt to exit the vehicle and lock the doors with either front door handle Request Switch while the Intelligent Key is inside the vehicle, a rapid beep tone will sound and the doors will not lock.

REMOTE KEYLESS ENTRY SYSTEM (KEYFOB) & INTELLIGENT KEY SYSTEM SHARED FEATURES OPENING FRONT WINDOWS WITH THE KEYFOB/INTELLIGENT KEY

Press and hold down the **UNLOCK** button for more than 3 seconds, and continue pressing until the windows are completely open.

ACTIVATING/DEACTIVATING THE HORN BEEP FEATURE

You may program your Keyfob/Intelligent Key to sound the horn when locking the vehicle.

To activate: Press and **hold** down the **LOCK** and **UNLOCK** buttons together for at least 2 seconds. The hazard indicators **will** flash once and the horn **will** chirp once to confirm the operation is complete.

To deactivate: Again, press and **hold** down the **LOCK** and **UNLOCK** buttons together for at least 2 seconds. The hazard indicators **will** flash three times to confirm the operation is complete.

AUTO RE-LOCK FUNCTION

When the doors are unlocked with the door handle Request Switch or the **UNLOCK** button on the Keyfob/Intelligent Key, for security, after one minute all doors will automatically relock unless the following occurs:

- Any door is opened.
- The ignition switch/knob is turned to the **ON** position.

Notes:

- The time for the Auto Re-Lock function can be modified or turned OFF. To adjust the setting: Press the SETTING button and highlight Vehicle Electronic Systems on the center Display Screen, then press ENTER. Highlight Auto Re-Lock Time, then press ENTER. Use the Infiniti Controller to adjust the time to your preference. Press ENTER to set the new Auto Re-Lock Time. Refer to section 4 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.
- Close proximity of a cell phone to the Intelligent Key may interfere with the Lock/Unlock logic.

OPENING/CLOSING FRONT WINDOWS AND LOCKING/UNLOCKING DOORS WITH EMERGENCY OR WALLET KEYS

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

Turn the driver's door key lock with the following keys to lock and unlock the doors and open and close the front windows while you are outside of the vehicle.



CHILD SAFETY REAR DOOR LOCK

Refer to section 1 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

- The safety lock levers are located on the inside edge of the rear doors.
- When the lever is in LOCK position, the door can be opened only from the outside. If you cannot open a rear door from the inside, check the child safety lock lever.

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OPENING FUEL-FILLER DOOR

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

To open the fuel-filler door:

- 1 Unlock the doors with the Keyfob/Intelligent Key or power door lock switch.
- 2 Then, push in on the left-hand side (9 o'clock position) of the fuel-filler door.



Note: YOU MUST use the Keyfob/Intelligent Key or power door lock switch to unlock the fuel-filler door. If the driver or front-passenger uses the inside door lock knob to unlock and exit the vehicle, the fuel-filler door will remain LOCKED and will not open as noted above.

FUEL-FILLER CAP HOLDER

When you are refueling, place the fuel-filler cap in the fuel-filler cap holder.

MEMORY SYSTEM – DRIVER'S SEAT, STEERING & OUTSIDE MIRRORS (AUTOMATIC DRIVE POSITIONER)

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature. With the transmission in **P** (**PARK**), the Memory system can automatically:

- Move the driver's seat BACKWARD and the steering wheel UP to ease entering and exiting the vehicle (Entry/Exit Assist feature).
- Adjust the driver's seat, steering column, and outside mirrors to two separate memorized positions.



Located on Driver's Door

These features can be turned **ON** or **OFF**. To adjust the settings: Press the **SETTING** button and highlight **Vehicle Electronic Systems** on the center Display Screen, then press ENTER. Highlight **Adjust Driver Seat When Exiting Vehicle** and/or **Lift Steering Wheel When Exiting Vehicle**, and press ENTER to turn features **ON** or **OFF**.

To Set Customized Seat, Steering, and Mirror Position Memory:

- 1 Turn the ignition switch/knob **ON**. Keep the transmission in **P** (**PARK**).
- 2 Adjust the seat, steering wheel, and outside mirrors to the desired positions.
- 3 Press the **SET** button. The indicator lights on both **Memory button 1** and **2** will illuminate.
- Within 5 seconds, press Memory button 1 or 2 and hold down for at least 1 second. The indicator light on the Memory button you select will blink ON and OFF one time and then illuminate solid amber for approximately 5 seconds. Seat/steering/mirror memory is now set to your preference.
- 5 Link the seat/steering/mirror memory to your Keyfob/Intelligent Key.
 While the indicator light on the Memory button is illuminated (see step 4, above) press
 the UNLOCK button on your Keyfob/Intelligent Key. The indicator light on the Memory
 button chosen will blink ON and OFF approximately 10 times. The memory positions are
 now matched to the Keyfob/Intelligent Key. You may set the second
 seat/steering/mirror memory positions to your other Keyfob/Intelligent Key by repeating
 the steps above.

Note: Always perform step 5 when setting seat, steering and mirror memory. If you DO NOT link memory to your Keyfob/Intelligent Key, whenever you unlock the vehicle with your Keyfob/Intelligent Key, the seat, steering column, and mirrors will move to the last position set.



INFINITI CONTROLLER

Refer to section 4 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature. Buttons located on the Infiniti Controller serve various purposes for navigating around the center Display Screen and choosing options. As you use the vehicle controls, you will find the control combination that best suits your needs.



Turn the Center Dial to navigate **UP**, **DOWN**, and **ACROSS** the center Display Screen, highlight items for additional information, and to make changes to settings.



2 Main Directional Buttons

Four Main Directional buttons (marked with arrows) on the face of the Infiniti Controller can also be used to perform the same functions as the Center Dial, above.

3 Additional Directional Buttons (for vehicles with the Infiniti Navigation system)
Four additional buttons, marked with small "dashes" are located between the Main
Directional buttons. When using the Navigation system for instance, these buttons can
be used in different ways to make "fine-tuned" movements around the Navigation Map
screen.

4 ENTER Buttons

When you use the Center Dial or Main Directional buttons to highlight a menu item, the text will display in **yellow**. Press either of the ENTER buttons to select the highlighted item.

5 BACK (Previous) Button

Press to return to the previous function shown on the center Display Screen, and to delete characters when using the on-screen keyboard.


6 VOICE Button (for vehicles with the Infiniti Navigation system)
Press to hear the next Navigation instruction. See the Navigation section of this guide (beginning on page 27) for more detailed Navigation system information.

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DASH-MOUNTED CENTER DISPLAY SCREEN

Refer to sections 4 in your Owner's Manual and the separate 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

Several vehicle functions are viewed on the center Display Screen in menus. Whenever a menu selection is made or menu item is highlighted, different areas on the screen may provide you with important information.

BUTTONS SURROUNDING THE INFINITI CONTROLLER

E/M Button (for vehicles without the Infiniti Navigation system) -



Press to change certain center Display Screen readouts (e.g. Heater and Air Conditioner temperature, Fuel Economy, Trip 1 and 2, etc.) from English/US to Metric (e.g. English/US = Mile, ° Fahrenheit, MPG; Metric = km, ° Celsius, L/100 km).

Notes:

- Center Display Screen readouts can also be changed as follows: Press the SETTING button and highlight System Settings on the center Display Screen, then press ENTER. Highlight Language/Unit, then press ENTER. Highlight Unit, and press ENTER to choose between English/US or Metric. For vehicles equipped with the Navigation system, this is the ONLY way that readouts can be changed.
- If Return All Settings to Default is chosen, the Unit setting does not default to either English/US or Metric. Therefore, in order to switch the Unit setting, you must again perform the procedure described above.

Press to set a destination in the Navigation system. See the Navigation section of this guide (beginning on page 27) for more detailed Navigation system information.

MAP Button (for vehicles with the Infiniti Navigation system)

Press to display the Map screen.

TRIP Button

Press and guickly release to view Trip Computer information (Elapsed

Time, Driving Distance, and Average Speed) for two distinct vehicle trip logs (Trip 1 and Trip 2), and additional information, if available (see "Notes" below).

Notes:

- For vehicles with the Infiniti Navigation system, pressing this button multiple times will display: Warning Message (if any exists), Trip 1, Trip 2, Fuel Economy, Maintenance (including Tire Pressure Monitor system).
- For vehicles without the Infiniti Navigation system, pressing this button multiple times will display: Trip 1, Trip 2, Trip OFF.

Press and **hold** down the TRIP button for approximately 2 seconds to quickly reset the information currently shown on the center Display Screen.

TRIP RESET Button (for vehicles without the Infiniti Navigation system)

In addition to pressing and holding the TRIP button, you can press and hold down the TRIP RESET button for approximately 2 seconds to quickly reset a trip log's Elapsed Time, Driving Distance, and Average Speed to zero.

ROUTE Button (for vehicles with the Infiniti Navigation system) _ ROUTE ₽₽ Press to display Route related information and settings. See the Navigation section of this guide (beginning on page 27) for more detailed Navigation system information. FUEL ECON FUEL ECON Button (for vehicles without the Infiniti Navigation system) -Provides Average Fuel Economy, a Fuel Economy visual gauge, and Distance to Empty. To quickly reset the fuel economy data back to zero, press and hold down the TRIP RESET button for approximately 2 seconds. DAY/NIGHT Button -Quickly press twice to switch the center Display Screen between day view and night view. Or, within approximately 10 seconds of pressing, you can adjust the center Display Screen brightness **UP** or **DOWN** by turning the Infiniti Controller Center Dial or pressing the Left/Right Main Directional buttons. Press and **hold** down to turn the display **OFF** entirely. To resume display, press the **SETTING** button and highlight **Display**, then press ENTER. Highlight **Display Off**, then press ENTER. The indicator light will go out. Press the **BACK** button two times to return to the main display screen. MAINT (Maintenance) Button (for vehicles without the Infiniti Navigation system) MAINT Press to display and set vehicle maintenance information (e.g. Engine Oil, Tire Rotation, Tire Pressure, etc.). SETTING Button -SETTING

STEERING WHEEL CONTROLS

BLUETOOTH® HANDS-FREE PHONE SYSTEM/AUDIO CONTROLS (if so equipped)

Refer to section 4 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

1 VOL (Volume) Control Switch

2 PHONE/SEND Button (11)

If a Bluetooth® -enabled cellular phone has been paired to the vehicle and is selected, press this button to:

- initiate a Bluetooth® Voice Recognition session
- answer an incoming call
- skip through system feedback
- enter commands during a call.

3 PHONE/END button

 Press at any time during a Bluetooth® Voice Recognition session to cancel the session and/or end a call.

MODE button

Press to change between radio preset banks A, B, and C; and CD.

4 **∧SEEK ∨** (Tuning) Switch

For Radio:

- Push the switch UP or DOWN for less than 1.5 seconds to page through the radio preset stations on the bank (A, B, or C) currently selected.
- Push the switch UP or DOWN for more than 1.5 seconds to seek the next or previous radio station on the band (AM, FM) or music category (SAT, if Satellite Radio is installed and activated) currently selected.

For Audio CDs and CDs with MP3/WMA:

- Push the switch UP or DOWN for less than 1.5 seconds to return to the beginning of the current track/folder/file or skip to the next track/folder/file. Push several times to skip BACKWARD or FORWARD through multiple tracks/folders/files.
- Push the switch **UP** or **DOWN** for **more than** 1.5 seconds to change to the next CD in the CD Changer (audio CD) or next folder on the CD (CD with MP3/WMA).



AUDIO CONTROLS

(if so equipped)

1 VOL (Volume) Control Switch

2 MODE button

Press to change between radio preset banks A, B, and C; and CD.

3 Power ON/OFF Button

Turns Audio System ON/OFF.

4 **∧SEEK ∨** (Tuning) Switch

For Radio:

- Push the switch UP or DOWN for less than 1.5 seconds to page through the radio preset stations on the bank (A, B, or C) currently selected.
- Push the switch UP or DOWN for more than 1.5 seconds to seek the next or previous radio station on the band (AM, FM) or music category (SAT, if Satellite Radio is installed and activated) currently selected.

For Audio CDs and CDs with MP3/WMA:

- Push the switch UP or DOWN for less than 1.5 seconds to return to the beginning of the current track/folder/file or skip to the next track/folder/file. Push several times to skip BACKWARD or FORWARD through multiple tracks/folders/files.
- Push the switch **UP** or **DOWN** for **more than** 1.5 seconds to change to the next CD in the CD Changer (audio CD) or next folder on the CD (CD with MP3/WMA).

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HOMELINK® UNIVERSAL TRANSCEIVER

(if so equipped)

Refer to the program card located in the owner's literature portfolio and section 2 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

This feature can memorize up to three unique signals to operate remote devices such as garage door openers.

ANTI-GLARE INSIDE (REAR VIEW) MIRROR WITH COMPASS

Refer to sections 2 and 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about these features.

The anti-glare feature of the inside mirror automatically changes reflection depending on the headlight intensity of the vehicle behind you. This feature is automatically **ON** when the vehicle is started.

To Turn the Anti-Glare Feature ON or OFF:

For vehicles with the HomeLink® feature:

- 1 Press the **b** button on the inside mirror to turn this feature **OFF**. The indicator light will go out.
- 2 Press this button again to turn the feature back **ON**. The indicator light will illuminate.

For vehicles without the HomeLink® feature:

- 1 Press and **hold** down the **b** button on the inside mirror for 3 seconds to turn this feature **OFF**. The indicator light will go out.
- 2 Press and hold down this button again for 3 seconds to turn the feature back ON. The indicator light will illuminate.

To Display a Compass Reading on the Inside (Rear View) Mirror:

For vehicles with the HomeLink® feature:

- 1 Press the $-\hat{N}$ button on the inside mirror to turn this feature **OFF**.
- 2 Press this button again to turn the feature **ON**.

For vehicles without the HomeLink® feature:

- 1 Press and quickly release the (b) button on the inside mirror to turn this feature OFF.
- 2 Press and quickly release this button again to turn the feature back ON.

OUTSIDE (SIDE VIEW) POWER MIRRORS

Refer to section 3 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

To Adjust the Outside (Side View) Mirrors:

- Move the switch to the LEFT or RIGHT to select the driver-side or passenger-side mirror.
- 2 Push the adjustment switch **UP**, **DOWN**, **LEFT**, or **RIGHT** to adjust the mirror to the desired position.

FRONT-PASSENGER AIR BAG STATUS LIGHT

Refer to section 1 in your Owner's Manual for detailed information regarding the Infiniti Advanced Air Bag system.

This vehicle is equipped with the Infiniti Advanced Air Bag system. Under some conditions, depending on pressure detected on the passenger seat and how the seat belt is used, the front-passenger air bag is designed to automatically turn **OFF**. When the front-

passenger air bag is **OFF**, the front-passenger air bag status light will illuminate*.

For example:

- When the system detects that the front-passenger's seat is occupied by a small adult, child or child restraint as outlined in the Owner's Manual, the will illuminate to indicate that the front-passenger air bag is OFF and will not inflate in a crash.
- When the front-passenger's seat is occupied and the passenger meets the conditions outlined in the Owner's Manual, the will not illuminate to indicate that the front-passenger air bag is operational.

*When the system detects that the front-passenger's seat is unoccupied, the passenger air bag status light will not illuminate even though the front-passenger air bag is OFF.



CRUISE CONTROL

(if so equipped)

Steering Wheel Mounted Cruise Controls

- 1 ACCEL/RES COAST/SET Switch
- 2 CANCEL Button
- 3 Cruise ON/OFF Button

To Set Cruise Control:

- Press the Cruise ON/OFF button. The cruise indicator light will illuminate.
- 2 Accelerate to the desired speed.
- Push DOWN on the COAST/SET switch and release it. The indicator light will illuminate. Cruise Control should be set to the desired speed.



INTELLIGENT CRUISE CONTROL (ICC)

(if so equipped)

Refer to section 5 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

Steering Wheel Mounted Cruise Controls

- 1 ACCEL/RES COAST/SET Switch
- 2 CANCEL Button
- 3 ON/OFF Button
- 4 Following Distance Button

The ICC system can be set to one of two cruise modes:

- Vehicle-to-vehicle distance-control cruise
- Conventional fixed-speed cruise.

To Set Vehicle-to-Vehicle Distance-Control Cruise:

Press the **ON/OFF** button for **less than 1.5 seconds**. The **CRUISE indicator light** will illuminate.

The **set distance** and **set vehicle speed** indicator lights will – also illuminate in STANDBY mode .



- 2 Accelerate to the desired speed.
- 3 Push DOWN on the COAST/SET switch and release it. Cruise Control should be set to the desired speed.
 - When a vehicle IS NOT detected ahead of you in the lane, the set distance and set vehicle speed indicator – lights will illuminate in SET mode
 - When a vehicle IS detected ahead of you in the lane, the vehicle ahead detection, set distance, and set vehicle speed indicator lights will illuminate in SET mode



driving controls

To Set Conventional Fixed-Speed Cruise:

- 1 While Cruise Control is **OFF**, press the **ON/OFF** button and **hold** down for **more than 1.5 seconds**. The **CRUISE indicator light** will illuminate.
- 2 Accelerate to the desired speed.
- Push **DOWN** on the **COAST/SET** switch and release it. The **SET** indicator light will illuminate. Cruise Control should be set to the desired speed.

Note: There are certain conditions under which vehicle-to-vehicle distance-control and/or fixed-speed cruise cannot be set or will automatically cancel. Four such conditions are shown below.

- When rain, snow, or dirt cover the system sensor (located in front bumper opening).
- When the windshield wiper is operated at low or high speed.
- When strong light shines directly on the front of the vehicle (e.g. during sunrise or sunset).
- When the Automatic Transmission is in Manual Shift mode.

Refer to section 5 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

To Switch Between the Two Cruise Control Modes:

When one of the two cruise modes is in use, you must turn the system **OFF**, and then **ON** again (as instructed above) to select the other Cruise Control mode.







HEADLIGHTS

Refer to section 2 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

- Parking, tail, license plate, and instrument panel lights **ON** Turn the headlight switch to **ED 45**
- Headlights **ON** (all other lights remain **ON**) Turn the headlight switch to **□**.
- Fog lights **ON** Turn the headlight switch to **ID** . Then, turn the fog light switch to **ID**.
- High beam **ON** Push the lever **FORWARD** (away from you).

AUTOLIGHT (AUTOMATIC HEADLIGHT) SYSTEM OPERATION

(if so equipped)

Refer to section 2 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

The Autolight (Automatic Headlight) System can automatically:

- Turn the headlights **ON** when it is dark.
- Turn the headlights **OFF** when it is light.
- Keep the headlights ON for 30 to 180 seconds after you turn the ignition switch/knob to OFF and close all doors. Details on how to adjust this feature, called the Automatic Headlights Off Delay, are provided below.

To activate the Autolight System: Turn the headlight switch to the AUTO position.



The All Wheel Drive (AWD) system is ready and waiting to automatically supply additional traction from the front wheels in various weather conditions.



SNOW MODE ON/OFF SWITCH

Refer to section 2 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

Driver-selectable "Snow Mode" helps improve low speed traction for slick weather conditions.

- Push the dash-mounted "SNOW" switch ON for slick road conditions. The indicator light on the switch will illuminate when SNOW mode is ON.
- Push the switch OFF for all other road conditions.

LANE DEPARTURE WARNING (LDW) BUTTON

(if so equipped)

Refer to sections 2 and 5 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

When **ON**, the Lane Departure Warning (LDW) system generates visual and audible warnings indicating when your vehicle is about to unintentionally move out of its travel lane where lane markers are detectable.

LDW operates in one of two modes:

- AUTOMATIC MODE, or
- MANUAL (OFF) MODE

AUTOMATIC MODE

LDW is automatically **ON** whenever you start the vehicle. It then activates at vehicle speeds over 45 mph.



To Turn LDW from ON to OFF for One Drive ONLY:

With the LDW button indicator light illuminated **ON**:

- LDW OFF Press the LDW button (the indicator light on the button will go out).
- LDW ON Press the LDW button again. The indicator light on the button will illuminate when the system is turned ON.

MANUAL (OFF) MODE

For your convenience, you may choose to manually override the LDW system so that it doesn't turn **ON** when you start the vehicle. In this Mode, there will be **no** visible or audible warnings when your vehicle is about to move out of its travel lane.

To Change from LDW AUTOMATIC MODE to MANUAL (OFF) MODE:

- 1 Turn the ignition switch/knob to ON.*
- 2 Verify the LDW button indicator light is still illuminated after the 5 second self-check.
- 3 Press the LDW button one time to turn the LDW button indicator light **OFF.**
- 4 Press and **hold** down the LDW button for approximately **5 seconds** until you hear **five beeps**. The LDW button indicator light should now **go out**.

To Change From LDW MANUAL (OFF) MODE to AUTOMATIC MODE:

- 1 Turn the ignition switch/knob to ON.*
- Verify the LDW button indicator light is not illuminated after the 5 second self-check.
- Press and **hold** down the LDW button for approximately **5 seconds** until you hear **five beeps**. The LDW system should now be changed to AUTOMATIC mode.

*No matter whether LDW is in MANUAL (OFF) or AUTOMATIC modes, when the ignition is turned to **ON**, a LDW button indicator light self-check occurs, with the LDW button indicator illuminating for 5 seconds.

To Verify Whether the LDW System is in AUTOMATIC or MANUAL (OFF) MODE:

Turn the ignition switch/knob to the **LOCK** position. Then turn it back to **ON**.

After the initial LDW button indicator light self-check, if the system is:

- In **AUTOMATIC MODE**, the LDW button indicator light **will** be illuminated.
- In MANUAL (OFF) MODE, the LDW button indicator light will not be illuminated.

REAR VIEW MONITOR

Refer to section 4 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

When the transmission is in **REVERSE**, the center Display Screen will automatically change to view the area behind the vehicle.

HEATER AND AIR CONDITIONER (DUAL-ZONE AUTOMATIC TEMPERATURE CONTROL)

Refer to section 4 in your Owner's Manual for complete Heater and Air Conditioner operation instructions.

Note: The bottom section of the center Display Screen shows a constant display. This display can be changed to show either Heater and Air Conditioning (HVAC) or Audio information, as follows: Press the **SETTING** button and highlight **Display** on the center Display Screen, then press ENTER. Highlight **Lower Display Setting**, and press ENTER to choose between **HVAC** or **Audio**.

To Turn Climate Control ON and Set Climate Control to Automatic (AUTO) Mode:

Press the **AUTO** button to turn the system **ON**. "**AUTO**" will appear on the center Display Screen and the indicator light on the **AUTO** button will illuminate.



The **AUTO** mode setting can be used year round. It allows the system to self-adjust to constantly maintain a selected temperature (automatic cooling and/or dehumidified heating). Air flow distribution and fan speed are also controlled automatically.

Standard AUTO Mode vs. DUAL Mode

- Standard AUTO mode allows the driver to control temperature for self and passenger.
- **DUAL mode** allows the driver and passenger to control their own cabin temperatures.

Press the **DUAL** button to turn DUAL mode **ON** and **OFF.** An indicator light on the **DUAL** button illuminates and the word



"Dual" can be seen on the center Display Screen when DUAL Mode is operating. Whenever the PASSENGER Temperature Control button is pressed while the system is operating, DUAL mode will also be turned ON.

To Change Temperature Settings:

- In **Standard AUTO mode**, press the **DRIVER Temperature Control** button **UP** or **DOWN** to increase or decrease the temperature and set it to the desired level. For normal automatic climate control operation, adjust the temperature to about 75°F.
- In **DUAL mode**, the passenger can press the **PASSENGER Temperature Control** button to adjust their temperature setting, while the driver still controls his/her setting using the **DRIVER Temperature Control** button.

To Control Fan Speed:

- Press the Fan Speed Control buttons, + or to manually adjust fan speed UP or DOWN. The illuminated fan speed indicator on the center Display Screen will change as fan speed is increased/decreased. The mode will change from AUTO to MANUAL mode ("AUTO" no longer appears on the screen).
- 2 Press the **AUTO** button to return to automatic control of fan speed.

To Turn Climate Control System OFF:

Press the OFF button.

To Turn Heat ON:

1 Press the A/C button until "A/C OFF" is displayed on the center Display Screen and the indicator light on the A/C button turns OFF.

2 Press UP or DOWN on either the Driver Temperature Control button (in Standard mode) or the Passenger Temperature Control button (in Dual mode) to increase or decrease cabin temperature.

Note: For optimum system operation, **DO NOT** set the inside cabin temperature lower than the outside air temperature.

To Choose Fresh or Recirculated Air:

Press the Fresh Air/ Air Recirculation (Intake Air Control) button to select between:

- Fresh (outside) air for cooling/heating/defrosting. The indicator light on the side of the Intake Air Control button will illuminate when fresh air is selected.
- Recirculated (inside) air for maximum A/C cooling performance and to prevent unwanted outside odors from entering the vehicle. The indicator light on the side of the Intake Air Control button will illuminate when recirculated air is selected.

Notes:

- Recirculated air mode cannot be activated when the system is set to A/C and the Front Defroster is ON.
- Extended use of recirculated air may cause the inside of the windows to fog up.

To return to automatic control mode, press and hold down the Intake Air Control button for approximately 2 seconds. Both indicator lights on the button will flash twice. Intake air will once again be automatically controlled.

To Manually Change Air Flow:

Press the MODE button to select air flow location.

MODE

- Air flows from center and side vents.
- Air flows from center and side vents, plus foot outlets
- Air flows mainly from foot outlets.
- Air flows from the front defroster and foot outlets.

Note: The air flow indicator symbols will illuminate on the center Display Screen.

To Turn Front Defroster ON/OFF:

Press the Front Window Defroster button (1) to turn it ON. The indicator light will illuminate on the Defroster button and the front defrost indicator symbol will illuminate on the center Display Screen.

Notes:

- Pressing the Defrost button provides the best possible defrost action. This is the preferred method for quickly defrosting the window (rather than choosing the front defroster and foot outlets Manual Air Flow control mode, which is less efficient).
- When you press this button, you may hear a click noise from the engine area. This is normal. The Air Conditioner compressor is being activated. With A/C ON, moisture is pulled from the air, helping to defrost the inside windows more quickly.
- 2 Press UP or DOWN on the Driver Temperature Control button to set the desired temperature.
- 3 Press the + Fan Speed Control button to set fan speed to maximum.
- 4 Press the **Front Window Defroster** button **again** to turn it **OFF**.

To Turn Rear Defroster ON/OFF:

- Press the **Rear Window Defroster** button with to turn it **ON**. The indicator light will illuminate on the Defroster button and the rear defrost indicator symbol will illuminate on the center Display Screen.
- 2 Press the button again to turn it OFF. Or, it will turn OFF automatically after approximately 15 minutes.

- No satellite radio reception is available and no SAT-related information will be displayed when the RADIO button is pressed unless an optional satellite receiver and antenna are installed, and an XM[®] or SIRIUS™ satellite radio service subscription is active.
- The bottom section of the center Display Screen shows a constant display. This display can be changed to show either Audio or Heater and Air Conditioning (HVAC) information, as follows: Press the **SETTING** button and highlight **Display** on the center Display Screen, then press ENTER. - The CD/DVD player is located on the rear side of the front Center Console. Auxiliary input jacks (located on the CD/DVD player face plate) may be used with compatible devices such as video game systems, portable digital players, camcorders, and other portable video devices.

- Press the button on the steering wheel to initiate a Bluetooth® Voice Recognition session.

SETTING UP YOUR PHONE BOOK - ADDING NEW ENTRIES

Each paired phone has its own dedicated phone book. Each phone book can store up to 40 voicetags (voice-activated dialing). Each voicetag can have up to 4 locations/phone numbers: Home, Office, Mobile, and Other.

- 1 Press the button.
- 2 Say "Phone Book"
- 3 When prompted, say "New Entry."
- When prompted, say the name you would like to give the new entry. For example, say "Michelle." If the name is too short or too long, or if it sounds too much like a name that is already stored in the phone book, the system will tell you and prompt you to say a name again. Modify the name and say it again.

Press and hold down to turn the display OFF entirely. To resume display, press the SETTING button and highlight Display, then press ENTER. Highlight Display Off and press ENTER to turn the indicator light OFF. Press the BACK button two times to return to the main display screen.
- 6 **SETTING Button** Use to set Navigation preferences.
- 7 ENTER Buttons Use to select menu items highlighted on the center Display Screen.
- 8 **Center Dial** Turn the dial to navigate **UP**, **DOWN**, and **ACROSS** the center Display Screen.
- 9 Main Directional Buttons Press to navigate UP, DOWN, and ACROSS the center Display Screen.
- 10 Additional Directional Buttons Depending on which Map is displayed (Plan View or Birdview ™), use these buttons to make "fine tuned" movements around the center Display Screen.
- 11 **BACK (Previous) Button** Press to return to the previous function shown on the center Display Screen, and to delete characters when using the on-screen keyboard.
- 12 **VOICE Button** Press to hear the next Navigation instruction.
- 13 **ZOOM OUT Button** Increases the Map view, showing more area.
- 14 **ZOOM IN Button** Decreases the Map view, showing greater detail.

STORING YOUR HOME (AND OTHER ADDRESSES) IN YOUR ADDRESS BOOK

- 1 Press the **DEST** button.
- 2 Highlight Address Book, then press ENTER.
- 3 Highlight Home Location (Add New), then press ENTER.
- 4 A confirmation message will appear, reading "Home location not stored. Store now?" Highlight **Yes**, then press ENTER.
- 5 Highlight **Street Address**, then press ENTER.
- 6 Input the House Number by highlighting each character and pressing ENTER.
- 7 Once complete, highlight **OK** and press ENTER.
- 8 Input the Street Name by highlighting each character and pressing ENTER. To insert a space, highlight and press ENTER.
- 9 Once complete, highlight **OK** and press ENTER.
- 10 Highlight the correct street and city from the list, then press ENTER.
- 11 Press ENTER again. "Home location stored" will appear on screen.
- 12 Press the MAP button to return to the Map screen.


- You can store other addresses by repeating the steps above. In step 3, highlight None (Add New), then press ENTER.
- In step 5, you may also choose alternate ways to store an address, including Map and Previous Destinations. Refer to your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more information.
- A unique sound (e.g. a chime, a dog bark, etc.) can be "attached" to your Home or Other Addresses in your Address Book. If a sound is attached to an Address Book entry, whenever you approach that location, the sound will be heard. Refer to section 6, Storing a location/route/MINOR ADJUSTMENT OF THE STORED HOME AND LOCATIONS in your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more information.


DELETING YOUR HOME (OR OTHER ADDRESSES) IN YOUR ADDRESS BOOK

- 1 Press the **SETTING** button.
- 2 Highlight **Navigation**, then press ENTER.
- 3 Highlight Address Book, then press ENTER.
- 4 Highlight **Stored Location**, then press ENTER.
- 5 Highlight Home Location or another stored location in the address book list, then press ENTER.
- 6 Highlight **Delete**, then press ENTER.
- 7 "Delete home location?" or "Delete stored location?" will appear on screen.
- 8 Highlight **Yes**, then press ENTER.
- 9 Press the MAP button to return to the Map screen.

TURNING VOICE GUIDANCE ON/OFF AND ADJUSTING VOLUME

- 1 Press the SETTING button.
- 2 Highlight Guidance Voice.
- 3 Press ENTER to select **ON** or **OFF**. The indicator light will illuminate **ON** when Voice Guidance is **ON**.
- 4 To adjust the volume, highlight **Guidance Volume** and press ENTER. Then turn the Infiniti
 Controller Center Dial or press the Left/Right
 Main Directional buttons.
- 5 Press the MAP button to return to the Map screen.





WHERE AM I?

- 1 Press the **ROUTE** button.
- 2 Highlight Route Information, then press ENTER.
- 3 Highlight Where am I?, then press ENTER. The names of the next, current, and previous street will display.
- 4 Press the MAP button to return to the Map screen.



STORE CURRENT LOCATION

You can store the current physical location of your vehicle in your address book.

- 1 While the Map screen is displayed, press ENTER.
- 2 Highlight **Store Location**, then press ENTER.
- 3 A confirmation message will appear, confirming that the location has been stored to your address book. The location will be stored in the first available position in your address book.
- 4 Press the MAP button to return to the Map screen.

PROGRAMMING A DESTINATION

There are several methods you can use to program your Navigation System to guide you to a desired destination point. Shown below and on page 30 are three of the most common destination programming methods.

Refer to section 4, **Setting a destination** in your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for additional available methods.

Note: The vehicle must be stationary before performing destination programming.

PROGRAMMING A DESTINATION - STREET ADDRESS

- 1 Press the **DEST** button.
- 2 Highlight **Street Address**, then press ENTER.
- 3 Input the House Number by highlighting each character and pressing ENTER.
- 4 Once complete, highlight **OK** and press ENTER.
- 5 Input the Street Name by highlighting each character and pressing ENTER. To insert a space, highlight and press ENTER.
- 6 Once complete, highlight **OK** and press ENTER.
- 7 Highlight the **correct street and city** from the list, then press ENTER.
- 8 Highlight **OK**, then press ENTER to set the destination and calculate the route.
- 9 Highlight **Start**, then press ENTER to begin route guidance.

Programming a Destination – Points of Interest (POI)

- 1 Press the **DEST** button.
- 2 Highlight Points of Interest (POI), then press ENTER.
- 3 Highlight a main category * (e.g. Restaurant, Shopping, Travel, etc.), then press ENTER.

Note: In this step you can also search for Points of Interest by Name. Refer to your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more information.



6 Destination

- 4 Highlight **Nearby POI**, then press ENTER.
- 5 Highlight the **desired selection** from the list, then press ENTER.
- 6 Highlight **OK**, then press ENTER.
- 7 Highlight **Start**, then press ENTER.

Note: **More Routes, Route Info.,** and **Add Way Pt.** are options available in addition to **Start.** Refer to your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more information.

- * Depending on the main category you highlight, you may have the option to make additional subcategory selections. For example:
- Highlighting Restaurant allows you the additional option to highlight a specific cuisine choice, such as Italian or Chinese.
- Highlighting Travel allows you the additional option to highlight Airport, Automobile Club, Tourist Attraction, etc. If Hotel is highlighted, another list of specific hotel chain names is provided from which you can choose.

PROGRAMMING A DESTINATION - NEARBY PLACES

- Press the **DEST** button.
- 2 Highlight **Others**, then press ENTER.
- 3 Highlight Nearby Places, then press ENTER.
- 4 Highlight a **category** (e.g. Restaurant, Gas Station, Hotel, etc.), then press ENTER.

Note: Depending on the category, you may be prompted to make additional selections.

- 5 Highlight the desired selection from the list, then press ENTER.
- 6 Select **Start**, then press ENTER.

Note: **More Routes, Route Info.,** and **Add Way Pt.** are options available in addition to **Start.** Refer to your 2006 Infiniti Navigation System Owner's Manual for more information.



After a destination is set in the Navigation System and a route has been plotted, you may want to delete the route while driving.

- 1 Press the **ROUTE** button.
- 2 Highlight Cancel Route Guidance, then press ENTER.
- 3 "Cancel current route?" will appear on screen.
- 4 Highlight Yes, then press ENTER.



FRONT ARMREST/CENTER CONSOLE STORAGE BOX

Refer to sections 1 and 2 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

- 1 **Top** button Press to open the top storage bin.
- 2 Middle button Press to slide the armrest FORWARD and BACKWARD.
- 3 **Bottom** lever Pull **UP** to open the bottom storage bin.

Inside you will find the following convenient features:

- 12-Volt Power Outlet
- Pass-through for a cell phone charger cord
- Top and bottom storage bins/slots

Four 12-Volt Power Outlets are available in your vehicle:

- Center Dash Outlet (located under the Analog Clock)
- Front Storage Box Outlet
- Rear Seat Outlet
- Luggage Area Outlet (located on the left side)

OPEN/CLOSE LIFT GATE (BACK DOOR/REAR HATCH)

Lift Gate Electronic Release Button

- 1 Unlock all vehicle doors (including the lift gate) by pressing the UNLOCK button on the Keyfob/Intelligent Key or either power door lock switch two times.
- 2 Press the Lift Gate Electronic Release button (located under the rear Infiniti symbol) to release the lift gate.
 - Use the handle to pull the door completely open.

Lift Gate Handle Request Switch -

For vehicles equipped **with** the Intelligent Key system you can also unlock the lift gate by pushing the Lift Gate Handle Request Switch.

Note: The Intelligent Key must be on "your person" to unlock the lift gate with the Lift Gate Handle Request Switch.

Closing Assist

When the lift gate is pulled down to an almost closed position, it will automatically pull itself to the completely closed position.


SPARE TIRE COVER

REAR CENTER SEAT BELT TONGUE/BUCKLE - SELECTING THE CORRECT SEAT BELT BUCKLE WHEN FASTENING

Refer to section 1 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

The rear center seat belt tongue can **ONLY** be fastened into the center seat belt buckle. The center seat belt buckle has "CENTER" printed on it.





REAR CENTER SEAT BELT STORAGE

Refer to section 1 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

- Use the **metal** ignition key to release the connector buckle.
- Retract the seat belt up to the retractor base (located in 2 the rear ceiling storage area).
- Fold the seat belt tongue against the seat belt so that it 3
- Secure the connector tongue into the retractor base.



REAR SEAT ADJUSTMENT

Refer to section 1 in your Owner's Manual for more details about this feature.

- Pull **UP** on the adjustment lever. —
- Adjust the seatback to the desired position, then release the lever.

REAR SEATS FOLD DOWN



- Remove the head restraints from the rear seats. 1
- 2 Position the left and right rear seat belts to the side.
- Stow the rear center seat belt in the rear ceiling storage 3
- Remove the cargo cover (if so equipped). 4
- To fold the rear seats flat, pull either:
 - the reclining levers (left side and right side) in the center area of the rear seats.
 - the levers (left side and right side) in the luggage area (rear hatch).

Note: When resetting the rear seats, be sure to re-install the head restraints.







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
